Keep More of What You Earned

Soon it will be time to start thinking about filing your 2018 tax return. When filing taxes, people are often unaware of the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC). This credit, available to low to moderate income wage earners and income-qualified families with dependents, will reduce your tax amount owed and could mean a refund. To qualify, you must meet certain requirements and file a tax return, even if you do not owe any tax or are not required to file.

Protect Yourself from Carbon Monoxide

Carbon Monoxide is created by the incomplete combustion of any fossil fuel, including natural gas or oil. It is a colorless and odorless substance that is difficult to detect. Here are some ways you can protect yourself against carbon monoxide:

- Keep snow away from boiler, furnace or water heater vents on the side of your home or business. Neglecting to do so could cause the airflow to be blocked, and could result in deadly gas migrating back into the building.
- Don't try to do it yourself! Always use a licensed plumbing and/or heating contractor when installing fuel-burning devices.
- Have a qualified professional inspect your fuel-burning devices annually to make sure they continue to operate properly.
- Make sure you have enough carbon monoxide alarms installed, based on the size and layout of your home. There should be one on every level, including the basement, near every bedroom and in other locations required by any applicable laws/building codes.

Rooftop Snow/Ice Buildup



During the winter months, it is important to keep your utility meter clear of snow and ice so it will operate properly. When snow and ice accumulate on your roof, there can often be an unexpected avalanche which can be dangerous to items underneath. This also applies to customers with solar panels. If your natural gas meter is located under solar panels, please contact us at 800-833-4200 to let us know. We will send someone out to assess the situation and work with you to determine alternative ways to protect your meter.

System Reliability

Have you ever wondered why it is not uncommon for our natural gas customers to have **zero** interruptions to their gas service? We work hard to provide our customers with unparalleled safe and reliable service.

We have a local Gas Control Center. Liberty personnel watch over our gas distribution system and take emergency calls 24/7 right from our local Gas Control Center in Londonderry, New Hampshire. We also have a very active gas system replacement program. Every year, we replace approximately 15 miles of cast iron and bare steel gas main. Replacing aging pipe with new pipe helps maintain the reliable services that we have always offered and decreases the amount of leaks that could occur.
