Kickstart summer with these savings tips

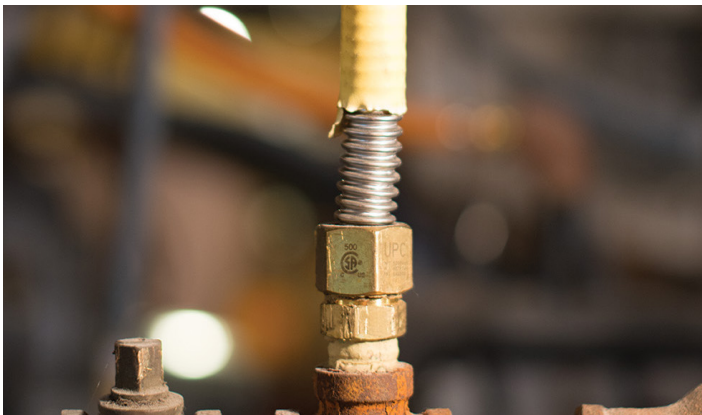
A few small steps could help you save energy, which may also lower your bill.

Caring for corrugated stainless steel tubing

Corrugated stainless steel tubing (CSST) is a thin-walled metallic gas piping product that can be used as an alternative to conventional gas piping material. This flexible piping is commonly coated in a yellow plastic. If your home uses CSST, we recommend that it is inspected by a qualified plumber for proper installation and bonding. CSST that is not properly bonded could cause an accidental leak or fire if struck by lightning.



Summer rates start May 1

Our summer rate period for Gas Supply begins on May 1 and continues until October 31. The Gas Supply charge on your bill represents what we pay for the gas that we deliver to our customers.

The price, based on projected demand and market conditions is calculated, then reviewed by the New Hampshire Public Utilities Commission. The price that we pay for gas is passed along to customers without a markup. Liberty does not profit from this charge.
