Weatherize your home – Sealing air leaks around windows, doors, and vents could help save energy and make your home more comfortable.

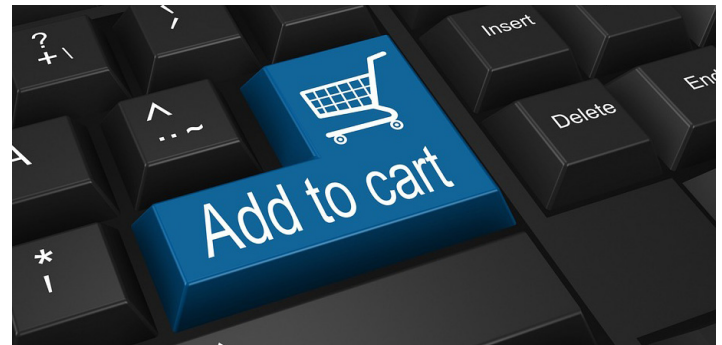
Beat the heat – Instead of cooking indoors, try grilling outside to reduce the heat coming into your home, which could decrease the load on your air conditioning.

Regional greenhouse gas initiative

The Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative (RGGI) is the first mandatory, market-based CO2 emissions reduction program in the United States. Carbon allowances are auctioned periodically, and the revenue we receive goes back to our customers in the form of a credit under transmission rates. **For the 2025–2026 period, which runs from May 1, 2025 through April 30, 2026, we will be giving \$5,319,800 back to our electric customers.** This money is distributed on a per kWh basis. Did you know that you have a choice in who supplies the electricity that we deliver to you? We encourage you to consider all available energy supply options to determine which one will best meet your needs.
