

Economic Development – Salem

Construction is confirmed to begin this year on a new mixed-use retail development, which will be located on the vacant Rockingham Park racetrack in Salem. A local developer plans to build grocery stores,

Natural Gas Coming to Windham and Pelham



In February 2017, Liberty Utilities received approval from the NH Public Utilities Commission (NHPUC) to expand natural gas service into Windham and Pelham, NH. Planning is underway in both towns. The initial plan is to start construction of the new system in summer 2017 and continue to build out the infrastructure and add customers over the next 4-5 years.

Understanding Your Bill – Consumption Tax Explanation

You may have noticed a charge on your electric bill labeled Consumption Tax. The Consumption Tax is mandated by the state. All electric customers in NH pay this tax based on electric usage. The current rate was set in 1997 (BSA 83-E). Collected funds are provided to the state and used for general purposes based on need determined by the State of NH.

Stay Clear, Stay Alive



When you are working in your yard, a neighbor's yard or anywhere else, please take a moment to look up. Overhead electrical wires can carry extremely high voltage and they can be deadly if contacted.

The simple act of carrying a ladder, working with scaffolding, using a lift vehicle or transporting any long object could result in tragedy if it comes in contact with overhead power lines.

Please maintain at least 10 feet of clearance from overhead power lines. If your project requires that you get closer than 10 feet, please call us and we will work with you to find a solution.

Did You Know, You Don't Have to Buy Your Power from Liberty?

You have the option to purchase your electricity from a third party, known as an energy marketer or energy supplier.

If you do switch to another supplier, Liberty Utilities will continue to deliver your electricity, respond to service and emergency needs and provide storm restoration services. We encourage you to consider all available energy supply options and determine which one will best meet your needs.

Planning a Project that Requires Digging?



Before you dig for any reason, call 811 giving 72 hours advance notice. The 811 operator will contact all the utility companies in your area. Each utility will mark where their underground services are located so you can avoid them when digging. Hand digging is required when working within 18" of a utility marking (Safety or Tolerance Zones).

Coming in contact with an underground utility service is not only dangerous but it may cause outages for you and your neighbors. Call 811. **It's free and it's the law.**
